376. WILLIAM STURGES WOODHULL, 7th generation, born May 29, 1826, was the second son and child of Samuel Woodhull and Mary Ann Bull.

He married, August 10, 1847, Elizabeth Ann, daughter of Elijah Tyrrell.

He died December 4, 1882.

They had no children.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH XXXIII.

HENRY ISAAC WOODHULL, seventh generation from Richard Woodhull I., Patentee of Brookhaven, Long Island, was the eldest son of Samuel Woodhull and Mary Ann Bull. He was born June 19, 1824.

In 1869 he joined his two brothers, Sereno Dwight and William Sturges, at Salt Lake City, Utah, where for two years before they had started a mining venture.

The three brothers opened an office, set up a mill and smelting works, and built a cabin up in the mountains, about twenty miles from Salt Lake City.

After their claim was staked out they employed about one hundred miners and other workmen, and started the mining business under the firm name of "Woodhull Brothers."

They sent out the first bullion ever produced in the State of Utah. It was taken from Gordon's Big Cottonwood Canyon. For a time they were greatly encouraged, but the venture was no easy one. All the ore had to be hauled by mule-team down the mountain and through the valleys for 20 miles to Salt Lake City.

426. **WILLIAM STURGES WOODHULL**, m. Elizabeth Ann Tyrrell, Aug. 10, 1847, Utica, New York. Elizabeth was the daughter of Elijah Tyrrell and Permelia Wilson and was born about 1830 and died Sep. 11, 1888 in San Francisco. William and his brother Henry formed a co-partnership in the Tailoring Business in about 1846, which was dissolved by mutual consent on Jan. 4, 1848. William, of Watertown, N.Y., also was once a partner of George Wiggins. William and his wife Elizabeth both died at San Francisco, California and were both buried in the Masonic Cemetery (Defunct), San Francisco, San Francisco County, California. William & Elizabeth had no children.
